

P: Lift up your hearts.


C: We lift them to the Lord.

*EUCHARISTIC PRAYER IV

Please kneel or remain standing, as you are able and are most comfortable.

P: Blessed are you, O God of the universe. Your mercy is everlasting and your faithfulness endures from age to age.

Praise to you for creating the heavens and the earth. Praise to you for saving the earth from the waters of the flood. Praise to you for bringing the Israelites safely through the sea. Praise to you for leading your people through the wilderness to the land of milk and honey. Praise to you for the words and deeds of Jesus, your anointed one. Praise to you for the death and resurrection of Christ. Praise to you for your Spirit poured out on all nations.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave you thanks and praise; he broke the bread, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave you thanks and praise, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

With this bread and cup we remember our Lord's passover from death to life as we proclaim the mystery of faith:




- P: O God of resurrection and new life: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine. Bless this feast. Grace our table with your presence.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION & RESPONSE

P: Jesus welcomes all to the table, to this meal of mercy.

These are the gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

C: Merciful God, we do not presume to come to your table trusting in our own righteousness, but in your abundant mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat and drink the body and blood of your dear Son, Jesus Christ, that we may live in him and he in us, now and forever. Amen.

DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

All are welcome at the Lord's Table. Communion is distributed to the baptized, and blessings are provided to the unbaptized, at the altar rail.

Please come forward, and either stand or kneel at the altar rail. Please open your hands, palms up, and a small host, the Body of Christ, will be presented to you. You may then either drink from the chalice of red wine, the Blood of Christ, or take a small cup from the tray with either red wine or white grape juice, the Blood of Christ. Once all have communed, a blessing will be given to the group, and you can then return to your seat via the outside aisles.

If you would like a blessing in lieu of Communion, please cross your arms over your chest and bow your head. If you are unable to come to the altar or do not wish to do so, the communion ministers will bring Communion to you in your seat.

POST-COMMUNION BLESSING

- P: The Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen and preserve you in eternal life.
- C: Amen.

*PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

- A: Let us pray. O God of love and provision,
- C: through this sacred feast you have strengthened us and appointed us to be your servants. Send us now into the world to do good and to share our possessions with all in need. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.


